Jonathan Stein and Law Offices of Jonathan Stein are pleased to announce the publication of Mr. Stein's second article on state-recognized Indian Tribes, in the Santa Clara Law Review.

Entitled, Koenig and Stein, "*Federalism and State Recognition of Native American Tribes: A Survey of State-Recognized Tribes and State Recognition Processes Across the US*", 48-1 Santa Clara Law Review 79 (2008), the law review article is the first scholarly compilation of 62 Indian Tribes recognized by the 16 states of their domicile. None of these Indian Tribes is federally recognized, but each has instead been recognized by a sovereign state.

The article explains the diversity of mechanical and legal forms used in state recognition and how this diversity is part and parcel of the federalist system. It categorizes the different types of state recognition, their legal import, whether a state Indian reservation was created, and the eras of each recognition. It also tabulates the various state agencies dealing with each Tribe and the history of the Indian Tribe. ###
